### **Subject: Donation of Biodiesel Technology**

Dear Rosalynn and Jimmy:

WaterSmart is a manufacturer of water and wastewater treatment equipment with some 20 product lines. For the last five years we have been developing a waste-to-energy process based on our patented anaerobic digestion technology. By managing wastes as a resource rather than a burden on society one can generate a quite positive return on investment. As an example, I have attached a now obsolete feasibility study on a California dairy farm.

Just after 9/11 we unsuccessfully tried to donate our waste-to-energy technology to the USA (see attached letters) for the purpose of eliminating our country's dependence on foreign oil. Since that time we have studied biodiesel refining which is but another marketplace application of our anaerobic digestion technology. We have concluded that biodiesel represents the fuel of the future in that it can replace all fossil petroleum fuels on a marketplace competitive basis, can be used for heating, for cooling, for transportation, and for generating electricity. 2. That you redeploy the biodiesel technology to the 25 countries within a 5 year period, and
3. That we receive absolutely no publicity as a result of this donation as our interests are humanitarian only. There is no better institution in the world than The Carter Center to effectively distribute this wonderful technology.

As a small company we are now attempting to develop a relationship with either a large Agri Company or a large oil company to market the biodiesel within the USA in order to make our country energy independent as quickly as possible. We are also independently marketing our waste-to-energy technology to pig and dairy farms and other waste generators for the same purpose. We are not interested in publicity or assistance.

In connection with your possible acceptance of the donation of the biodiesel technology and redeployment of same, our company is willing to directly implement the technology in each country, or willing to participate as a technical advisor only, or to completely refrain from acting in any manner, or any combination of the above. Our only desire is to see the technology on the ground in a timely manner as the humanitarian woes of many are felt by me each and every day.

My personal curriculum vitae is attached. In 1984 I filed for a chapter 7 bankruptcy, in about 1993 a chapter 13, and my credit rating stinks. Notwithstanding, I have a strong love of my country for the opportunity to succeed as well as an appreciation of the plight of many populations around the globe. You and Jimmy are in the best position to promote democracy and sustainable economies on a worldwide basis with our biodiesel technology. I greatly appreciate your past humanitarian accomplishments and I know you and Jimmy can withstand the extended workload this technology will require. I know in advance you and Jimmy will pursue the work with passion.

A complete technology information package is attached for your review. Should Emory University have questions in their review, they may contact me as often as they wish. The biodiesel technology took us several months to fully understand and it would not be a surprise if others had to spend considerable time in their analyses.
